■ In transit to the British Museum for the recent exhibition, the Tutankhamun gold death mask was lifted—strictly legally—from an aircraft at Heathrow on the CB100 manufactured by ATEL at Southend. ### There goes OCL's giant new bay

■ Into service on the new Far East container run goes the world's largest and most powerful container ship—OCL's Tokyo Bay. First of five Liverpool Bay-class vessels, Tokyo Bay has a design trial speed of 30 knots, and her steam turbine machinery is rated at 81,120 shp.
