Apprenticed at 15 years of age to H. Hogarth & Sons of Glasgow. Captain Lockhart served that Company for some ten years, obtaining his Master's Certificate in October, 1941

He thereafter served as Chief Officer and Acting Master in the A.N.D. Ocean Angel, managed by Barr, Crombie & Co. of Glasgow, before joining the Anchor Line of Glasgow in June, 1944.

During his years at sea throughout the Second World War he participated in a number of Allied landings and saw action in most theatres of Merchant Navy operations, He was Chief Officer of the captured Italian vessel Empire Progress when this ship was tornedged and sunk with considerable loss of life whilst proceeding independently in the North Atlantic: for his action at this time he received the Kine's Commendation for Brayery. He stood by the Ocean Vanquisher building in California and was serving aboard as Chief Officer when she was sunk during the North African landings. He thereafter assisted for some time in general salvage operations in Algiers before proceeding to
