## Launch of the CLAN RANALD

CLAN RANALD, THE SECOND OF FOUR refrigerated motor cargo liners being built for the Group by the Greenock Deckyard Company Limited, was launched from Carstsyke Shipyard on Monday, 21st December, 1964. Mrs. A. Paxton, wife of the Managing Director of the Greenock Deckyard Company, performed the naming ocenomy.

The ship, which is of the closed shelter deck type, is powered by a single Burnesiter and Wain popper valve turbo charged engine built by John G. Kincaid & Company Limited of Greenock, and is fitted with extensive automatic and remote control systems including automatic temperature control for refriencated seasors.

Of the 500,000 cubic feet of insulated cargo space, 50,000 cubic feet will be at 0° F, for carrying quick frozen food such as fish and fruit.
