Europe-South Africa containers move in conventional ships

Though full cellular container services between Europe and South Africa will not begin until 1977, there are increasingly frequent movements of containerised shipments aboard conventional vessels. Aboard Union-Castle and Clan Line vessels, container loads are now moving regularly from Glasgow, Liverpool, London and Middlesbrough, and coming porthwayd.
